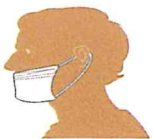

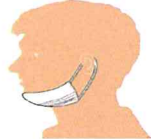

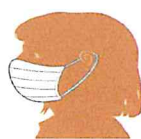

MASS HAS RESUMED AT ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA!

WE ARE SO PLEASED TO WELCOME YOU BACK TO ATTEND MASS AT ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA CHURCH.

The Archdiocese of New York and other dioceses throughout the United States have implemented safety measures in response to the Covid-19 pandemic which we will of course follow to insure the health and safety of our parishioners, visitors, staff and friars.

PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING CAREFULLY PRIOR TO COMING TO THE CHURCH FOR MASS, CONFESSION OR PRIVATE PRAYER.

- Those who are at a higher risk for COVID-19 (i.e., those who are older than 65 or who have underlying health conditions are urged not to come to church for Mass.
- Those who feel sick in any way (temperature higher than 99.5° F, cough, chills, muscle aches, headache, sore throat, or new loss of smell or taste) should not enter the church.
- Those who cannot attend Mass are encouraged to spend time daily reading the Scripture, praying with their families, watching live-streamed Masses, and making an act of Spiritual Communion.
- In accord with the current state policy, the faithful (over 2 years old) must wear cloth face coverings when in public, including when they come to church.
- Parishioners should sanitize their hands prior to entering the church for Mass or other public prayer opportunities.
- At arrival and departure times, entrance doors will be propped open to limit contact with door handles.

- Attendance at each individual Mass will be limited to no more than 25% of the church's occupancy permit.
- No paper bulletins will be distributed. Instead, parish bulletins/news will be posted to the parish website and on bulletin boards in the church and rectory.
- Parish safety volunteers and ushers will be trained to receive parishioners and escort them to suitable seating arrangements set up for social distancing for the protection of priests and parishioners.
- Holy water and baptismal fonts will be emptied.
- Communion will be distributed only via the Host; the Precious Blood will not be offered.
- There will be no greeting of people after the Mass.
- No physical contact during the *Sign of Peace* will be permitted.
- All present at Mass should sit 6 feet or more away from others. Families may sit together.
